Administrator's Report:

- Water Use Permits- On sale now with the new prices approved by Council.
- **PEP Grant-** We were awarded a \$1,000.00 grant from PEP to be used towards the purchase of an AED for Town Hall.
- **Health Department Grant-** We were awarded a \$2,000.00 grant through the Creating Healthy Communities Grant Program for the purpose of "purchasing and installing infrastructure that supports walking for transportation amongst the general public." We will be using the funds to repaint crosswalks and install new crosswalk signage.
- Water Tower Inspection- Nelson Tank and Engineering has been contracted to complete a general inspection of the tower this summer.
- Linden Avenue Lift Station Update- The project is still in the planning and design stage and moving forward.
- **Crown Castle Work-** Crown Castle will be performing some work and maintenance on the cell tower at Clearview. This work will involve the use of a large crane. We have notified both Widmer and Associates and Standard Wellness that this will be happening.
- Railroad Work- Omintrax notified the Village last week that they will be doing Tie and Surface work at the crossings in the Village in the very near future. We have notified the public of this to make them aware that the work will activate the crossing signals and caution needs to be used as there will be workers and vehicles present on the tracks.
- **Town Hall Generator Update-** We are working with IPS to set the best date possible for the installation of the generator and the power outage that will need to take place for the final hookup. Right now, we are looking at April 16th to 19th with the power outage taking place on Friday, April 19th.
