Mayor's Report:

- July 4th Weekend everyone be safe.
- Log Yard Project / Old Sunoco Station Property Update closing scheduled for 7/10/20.

Administrator's Report:

- CARES Act Funding- We completed all of the necessary paperwork for the \$69,589.82 that is directly earmarked for the Village of Gibsonburg through the act and we are working on an itemized list of non-budgeted expenses related to COVID 19 that will be reimbursed with our allocation.
- **Bulk Trash Drop Off-** At this time, Friday, July 31st and Saturday, August 1st will be the Bulk Trash Drop Off Days at Town Hall. We will release full information in the coming week, but it will have similar guidelines to last year's days.
- Targets of Opportunity Grant Public Hearing- With the Target of Opportunity Grant that is being submitted for the project uptown, we will need to have a Public Hearing. This is part of the grant requirements and we are scheduling it for Thursday, July 16th at 6:00pm here at Town Hall. In keeping with the size limitations on gatherings because of COVID-19, we are going to broadcast the hearing on the Gibsonburg, Ohio Facebook Page. This will satisfy the requirements and will allow for any interested members of the community to learn more about the project, the Targets of Opportunity Grant and have any questions they may have answered.
- Sandusky County Hazard Mitigation Plan Resolution- Last year we participated in the process with the EMA and other county agencies and governments to develop and revise the Sandusky County Hazard Mitigation Plan. Adopting the plan by resolution allows the Village of Gibsonburg to be eligible for federal mitigation funding if necessary. To meet the deadlines established, we're asking that it be passed in an emergency.
- Lined Avenue Lift Station Project- We closed out the project last week with the final disbursement form. The amount financed with OWDA was \$282,211.51 and the final contract with Speer Brothers was \$258,222.51.
- Alley Work- Work on alleys within the corporation limits continues.
- Ohio EPA Water Shut Off Order- The EPA has revoked/terminated the order put out March 31 2020 that prevented any water shut offs for non-payment from occurring. This will take effect on July 10, 2020. With the newest set of Utility Bills that have gone out, we have included a note to residents who are behind that explains this and what they need to do in order to correct any issues.
- **Public Nuisance Code-** We have re inspected all of the properties receiving notices and are actively working with the majority of them on clean-up efforts moving forward (no response as of yet from 500 E. Yeasting Street). We will continue to work on the properties designated as public nuisances.
